SEPTEMBER 4, 2016: TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend is Labor Day weekend. This weekend is traditionally seen as the unofficial end of summer, even though several more weeks of the summer are ahead of us. Our nation takes time to honor all those who earn a living through honest work. Work should never be an end in and of itself. Rather, work should serve to promote the well-being and dignity of each person while providing fair and just compensation.

So many people in our nation are unemployed and underemployed. Let's pray for those who sincerely wish to work but are unable to find work that can adequately support themselves and their respective families.

God's work never ends. The work of the Church is, ultimately, about the salvation of souls. Bringing the Catholic faith to the ends of the earth is the work given to Christ's Church. I would ask you to pray for all the children of our parish who have returned to school. Please pray for our Parish School of Religion program, which will starting very soon. Sharing our faith with the next generation is the greatest gift we can give to them.

On Sunday, September 4th, The Catholic Church will officially declare Mother Theresa of Calcutta a saint of the Catholic Church. Her work with the poorest of the poor through the community she founded (i.e. The Missionaries of Charity) is well documented. Her 69 years of service to Christ and His Church have been the subject of numerous biographies and films. She inspired countless number of men and women to reach out to those most vulnerable in our society.

The whole of Mother Teresa's life and labor bore witness to the joy of loving, the greatness and dignity of every human person, the value of little things done faithfully and with love, and the surpassing worth of friendship with God. But there was another heroic side of this great woman that was revealed only after her death. Hidden from all eyes, hidden even from those closest to her, was her interior life marked by an experience of a deep, painful and abiding feeling of being separated from God, even rejected by Him, along with an ever-increasing longing for His love. She called her inner experience, "the darkness." The "painful night" of her soul, which began around the time she started her work for the poor and continued to the end of her life, led Mother Teresa to an ever more profound union with God. Through the darkness she mystically participated in the thirst of Jesus, in His painful and burning longing for love, and she shared in the interior desolation of the poor. 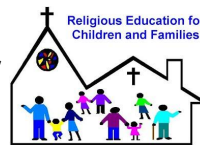
