OCTOBER 16, 2016: TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parish Family,

In his book, *Priests for the Third Millennium*, Cardinal Timothy Dolan observes that prayer must become like eating and breathing. We have to eat daily, not stock up on food on Monday, and then take off the rest of the week. Do we take ten deep breaths and say, "Good, that's over for a while, I won't have to breathe for a couple of hours?" Like eating and breathing, prayer must become a constant, daily part of our lives.

The readings for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time underscore the importance of persistence in prayer. Last week we heard about the importance of gratitude in the spiritual life. Gratitude must also be accompanied by perseverance. Some may ask, "God knows what I need, why should I bother asking?" The truth is that prayer does make a difference. God will always give us what we ask for or He will give us something better. God knows what is truly best for us. Indeed, in every prayer we are reaching out for God and we are opening the door to our hearts more and more.

Ultimately, it comes down to faith. Our Blessed Lord asks the question at the end of this Sunday's Gospel reading (Luke 18:8). He asks, "But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" The world needs the fire of faith to burn brightly in the lives of God's people. The devil will employ every tactic to destroy faith and to destroy families. We are in a spiritual war that has eternal consequences.

Prayer is not an option for the Christian. Prayer is essential. As a seminarian, I recall a Priest telling me quite simply, "Dan, if you don't pray you're dead." Our relationship with God can wither and die if it is not nourished by regular prayer and the sacraments of Penance and Eucharist.

Our Lord will help us to pray if we ask Him. In this month of October, perhaps a good place to begin is to commit ourselves to praying the Rosary each day. On October 7th, we celebrated the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. The Rosary is a powerful prayer and Our Lady asked us to pray it each day during her apparitions in Fatima, Portugal in 1917.

May our Lord, through the intercession of Our Blessed Mother and St. Patrick, bless us with prayerful hearts, homes and families.
