FEBRUARY 5, 2017: FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parish Family,

The Gospel for the Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time comes to us from Matthew 5: 13-16. Jesus tells his disciples that they “are the salt of the earth” and “the light of the world.” From ancient times, salt has been used to both preserve food and give it flavor. Light provides us with guidance and with warmth. The light from our sun is essential to life on our planet.

Our faith cannot be hidden away. Just as salt and light have their purposes and necessary functions, so too must faith be put into action for the good of our world and the glory of God. The prophet Isaiah, in today’s first reading, speaks of some of the ways in which we can do just that.

Thus says the LORD:

Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless;

clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own.

Then your light shall break forth like the dawn...

If you remove from your midst oppression, false accusation and malicious speech;

*if you bestow your bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted;
then light shall rise for you in the darkness, and the gloom shall become for you like midday.*

(Is. 58: 7-10)

God has blessed each of us with gifts and talents that are to be shared and not hidden “under a bushel basket.” The Church is always enriched when the faithful place their gifts at the service of Christ and his people. Let us pray that St. Patrick Parish will continue to be that “city set on a mountain” where the light of Christ shines brightly for all to see.

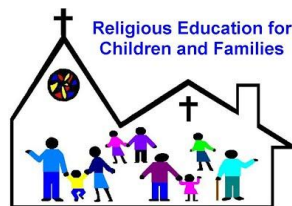
From the Good Sams...
