**MAY 14, 2017: FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER**

To my brothers and sisters in Christ:

**“Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me.”** These words of Jesus are words that he spoke to his disciple at the Last Supper. He wanted to comfort his Apostles for what would take place the next three days: His arrest, conviction, crucifixion, death and burial. This all needed to take place in order for us to do greater things, as Jesus tells us at the end of the Gospel: **“whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father.”** We are able to do greater things because we will have the Holy Spirit to inform and guide us in our efforts to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ. If we are unsure or afraid to proclaim the Gospel, whether in word or deed, the Holy Spirit will direct us as to what we are to say or do. If you do not believe this, just see what happened to the Apostles. These men were afraid when Jesus was crucified. After they received the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, they were no longer afraid and were able to offer their lives for the truth that Jesus is the Christ, that He rose from the Dead, and is the Son of God. They were able to do greater things than they were able to do before Jesus suffered, died and rose from the dead. This same Holy Spirit has been given to us and wants us to do greater things than we have been doing. It is possible for “with God, all things are possible.” Let us have faith in God and in Jesus Christ, in doing so, we will be able to do greater things than we could ever think or believe possible.

This Sunday is Mother’s Day. Let us remember our mothers, if deceased, through prayers and if alive, through our acts of love. We must not forget our heavenly Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary. She became our mother at the crucifixion, when Jesus gave her to the beloved disciple. Let us also honor her through her plea to pray the Rosary for Peace; the Peace that only God can give.

**Sanctity of LIFE on Tuesday, May 23**

The Knights of Columbus, St. Mary Council #15942 is honored to present to the parish **The Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose**. The Our Lady of Guadalupe Silver Rose has been a Knights of Columbus tradition for 57 years. In 1960, groups of Columbian Squires in Mexico, Canada and the United States decided to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe by carrying a rose across North America from Canada to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico. In 2001 Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson, at the 119th Supreme Council Meeting in Toronto, addressed the effort in culture of life terms, referring to the Our Lady of Guadalupe - One Life, One Rose Program. He urged that it be expanded to every North American jurisdiction. In recent years the program has expanded from three to six silver roses traveling the western, central, and eastern corridors of North America, with Knights of Columbus from Canada to Mexico carrying the roses from destination to destination, and finally to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico.

Please spend some time in prayer for the Sanctity of LIFE, on Tuesday, May 23, 2017, at St. Mary Church, Chardon beginning this day with time for private prayer, starting at 8:00 a.m. and concluding with the Silver Rose Prayer Program, starting at 7:00 p.m. Let us continue to be a people who honor and promote the Sanctity of LIFE.
