JUNE 11, 2017: THE MOST HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY

Dear Parish Family,

On May 31st, the Ohio Department of Education designated St. Mary School as a STEM school. St. Mary's is the first and only school in Geauga County to receive this outstanding designation. STEM is the abbreviation for *Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics*. It is a national initiative to encourage students to embrace these four, vital disciplines at an early age and, perhaps, as a profession upon completion of secondary or post-secondary education. As a nation, these disciplines enhance our ability to be a world leader in innovation and achievement.

As stated by the Ohio Department of Education: *The goal of STEM schools is to foster intellectual, entrepreneurial and technical talent. This is vital to Ohio's future economic growth and prosperity, which depends on an aligned education system to support the state's economic development efforts and that helps all Ohio students become innovators and inventors, self-reliant and logical thinkers and technologically proficient problem solvers. The Ohio Department of Education is a partner in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) focused on the infusion of high-level mathematics and science into curriculum.* (taken from <http://education.ohio.gov/Topics/Career-Tech/STEM>)

The U.S. Department of Education further underscores the need for STEM: *The United States has developed as a global leader, in large part, through the genius and hard work of its scientists, engineers, and innovators. In a world that's becoming increasingly complex, where success is driven not only by what you know, but by what you can do with what you know, it's more important than ever for our youth to be equipped with the knowledge and skills to solve tough problems, gather and evaluate evidence, and make sense of information. These are the types of skills that students learn by studying science, technology, engineering, and math—subjects collectively known as STEM.* (taken from <https://www.ed.gov/stem>)

I would like to express my sincere gratitude to our School Principal, Mary Petelin, the entire faculty, staff, support staff, volunteers and, of course, our students. Their hard work and dedication made this prestigious, STEM designation possible. St. Mary's is one of only seven Catholic schools in the entire Diocese of Cleveland to receive this honor. In fact, there are only 42 other schools in the entire state of Ohio that have received STEM-designation.

As a Catholic school, St. Mary's also focuses on enhancing the faith of our students. Formation of the mind and formation of the soul are at the heart of any Catholic school. May the greatest teacher of all, Our Lord Jesus Christ, continue to bless St. Mary School. Let us all continue to pray for those whose lives are dedicated to teaching our youth.
