*Dear Parish Family,*

This Sunday is the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel of Mark (Mark 6: 1-6) takes us to Jesus' "native place" where he is teaching in the synagogue. Those listening to him are "astonished." They know him, or so they think. They acknowledge his "wisdom" and "mighty deeds." Nevertheless, they "took offense at him." Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place..." The final sentence of the Gospel tells us that Jesus "was amazed at their lack of faith."

It appears that herein lies proof of the old adage, "familiarity breeds contempt." Familiarity, however, does not always result in contempt. We can be familiar with someone and have a great affection for that person. With respect to our faith, the things with which we are familiar are numerous. The sacraments, especially Penance and Eucharist, should be familiar to us. It's when we take them for granted that we run the risk of that familiarity breeding unhealthy sentiments. Likewise, God's word can lose its power for those who simply read it or hear it like any other word we might hear or read.

The remedy for this is the nurturing of our relationship with God through prayer. When we hear God's word, God is speaking to us. It is Christ Jesus who is the invisible minister of the sacraments. These are encounters with the living God!

Jesus "was not able to perform any mighty deed" in his native place, "apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them." Let's allow our Lord Jesus to lay his hands on us so as to heal us and strengthen us. May Our Lord do "mighty deeds" in our families and in the Church.
