Dear Parish Family,

As a Priest and as a Pastor, the First Reading for the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time resonates with the very core of my being. It is both cautionary and consoling. The prophet Jeremiah (23:1-16) speaks God's word and it is an indictment of the shepherds of God's people, Israel. "Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock of my pasture, says the Lord... You have scattered my sheep and driven them away. You have not cared for them, but I will take care to punish your evil deeds."

Our Lord then goes on to speak a hopeful word through Jeremiah. "I myself will gather the remnant of my flock from all the lands to which I have driven them and bring them back to their meadow... I will appoint shepherds for them who will shepherd them so that they need no longer fear and tremble; and no one shall be missing, says the Lord."

The true shepherd of God's people must always place the salvation of his soul and the souls of those entrusted to his care above all else. This means lovingly proclaiming the truth that leads people to Christ. The true shepherd does not mislead or scatter the flock. The teachings of the Catholic Church on faith and morals cannot arbitrarily be changed simply because the culture doesn't like or accept them. It takes courage to proclaim and live the Gospel in its fullness. Still, the Catholic Church, which was founded by Jesus Christ himself, possesses the fullness of truth as revealed by God.

Let's pray that the Lord will inspire more men to serve as Priests and as shepherds of God's people.
