Dear Parish Family,

The Gospel for the Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time comes to us from Mark 7:31-37. Our Lord heals “a deaf man who had a speech impediment.” Jesus “took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man’s ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, ‘Ephphatha!’- that is, ‘Be opened!’ – And immediately the man’s ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly.”

As he did so often, our Lord takes the time to heal someone on a personal level. More specifically, he actually touches them with his hands. For Jesus, there is no room for an impersonal approach to healing. Indeed, how many of those who experienced our Lord’s compassion had been ignored by the wider community? Sacramentally, the Lord Jesus continues His ministry of healing through the sacraments of Penance and the Anointing of the Sick. There too, the healing occurs in way that is not impersonal. Our Lord, working through His Church, reminds its members that they are loved and that they are not forgotten. No sin is greater than God’s mercy. No illness has the power to rob God’s people of faith, hope and love. When we experience God’s healing hand, our minds and hearts are truly opened to His grace and we experience restoration and wholeness. We, in turn, must share the good news.

Let us pray for all the suffering members of our parish family. May they experience God’s love and healing through dedicated caregivers and through the love and concern of the Church.
