Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday is the Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel of Mark (8:27-35) presents to us the Evangelist’s account of Peter’s profession of faith. Jesus asks the disciples who do people say that he is? He then asks them directly, “But who do you say that I am?” Peter says in reply, “You are the Christ.”

What happens immediately after is truly remarkable. Our Blessed Lord makes it clear to the disciples that “the Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days.” Peter then proceeds to rebuke Jesus who, in turn, rebuked Peter. “Get behind me Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do.” Our Lord explains to the disciples and to the crowd that those who wish to follow Him must deny themselves, take up their cross and follow Him. Indeed, “whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for (Jesus’) sake and that of the gospel will save it.”

Christian discipleship requires a radical, wholehearted commitment. This means taking up the cross each day. Crosses can come in a variety of forms. Crosses can also serve as a means of sanctification. When we join our sufferings with those of Christ, they can have a transformative quality that binds us closer to the Lord. The illnesses that come our way or those of a loved one, difficulties at work, concern about a loved one or a friend – these are but a few examples of crosses that can be taken up each day.

I pray that God will raise up faith-filled followers of Christ who will lose their lives for the sake of Jesus and the Gospel of the Lord.


