Dear Parish Family,

On Wednesday, November 7th, St. Mary Parish in Chardon will be offering Eucharistic Adoration all day beginning immediately after the 7:30 a.m. Mass. Adoration will continue throughout the day and will culminate with Benediction at 7:00 p.m. Please consider taking some time to be with our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament that day.

This Sunday, we hear both Moses and our Blessed Lord giving us the Great Commandment. Moses (Deut. 6: 2-6) spoke to the people and said:

"Hear, O Israel! The Lord is our God, the Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength."

When asked by one of the scribes which is the first of all the commandments, our Lord (Mark 12:28b-34) replied:

"Hear O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength."

Jesus then adds a second commandment:

"You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Indeed, the second commandment can be found in the Old Testament as well. Time and again God calls his people to love Him and one another. We see this in the words of the prophets whenever God called his people to be faithful. Treating others with justice and compassion are as essential to the Law as is the love of God. The two go hand in hand and Jesus, for his part, affirms this.

When we look at the Ten Commandments, we see that the first three deal with how we relate directly to God. The next seven deal with how we directly relate to other people. Still, each commandment, in a real sense, pertains to both relationships. We really cannot separate one from the other.

It is good for us to ask if our spiritual and moral struggles can be traced back to a need for a renewed prayer life. Are we attending to both body and soul? Can we truly be merciful and forgiving if we ourselves have not sought the mercy of God in the Sacrament of Penance? Can we truly give of ourselves if we have not prayed for the strength that comes from Him who gave His life for us? In short, have we truly put God first in our lives so that we might truly love as He loves?

The Psalm (18: 2-3, 3-4, 47, 51) for this Sunday, the Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time, proclaims:

"I love you Lord, my strength...The Lord lives! And blessed be my rock!"

May we echo those words by the way we live and the way we love.
