Dear Parish Family,

The Gospel for the Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (Mark 13:24-32) describes the end times. More specifically, Our Blessed Lord tells his disciples that there will be signs preceding his Second Coming. Indeed, when the branch of the fig tree becomes tender and sprouts leaves, one knows that summer is near. Likewise, when we see these things happening, we know that Christ is near, "at the gates."

Our Lord also tells his disciples that no one knows the day or the hour for His Second Coming – only the Father knows. For our part, we must be ready. We too know neither the day nor the hour when Christ will come again. We know not the day or the hour when we will be called from this life. We must be ready to account for our lives before the judgement seat of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

As we approach the end of Ordinary Time, we prepare for the season of Advent. A wonderful resolution we can make for the season of Advent is to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. It will serve to truly prepare for the way for the Lord into our hearts and homes.

In every Mass, we hear the words, "as we await the blessed hope and the coming our Savior, Jesus Christ." In the peaks and valleys of our lives (and all the times in between), let's never fail let that blessed hope burn within us. May we truly be prepared to see our Lord face to face.
