Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday, the Church celebrates the Baptism of the Lord. This celebration will bring with it the end of the Christmas season. The Church recalls Our Lord's second manifestation, or epiphany, which occurred when he was baptized in the Jordan by St. John the Baptist. Jesus descended into the river and, in doing so, he made its waters holy. This, in turn, gave them the power to beget children of God. In a very real way, he event takes on the importance of a second creation in which the entire Trinity intervenes.

It is good for us to reflect on our own baptism. Most of us do not remember the day of our baptism as we were baptized as infants or small children. Some, however, can recall it very clearly. These are the adults who were baptized at the Easter Vigil mass after being prepared through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.). In either case, the Catechism of the Catholic Church states the following:

1277 Baptism is birth into the new life in Christ. In accordance with the Lord's will, it is necessary for salvation, as is the Church herself, which we enter by Baptism.

1278 The essential rite of Baptism consists in immersing the candidate in water or pouring water on his head, while pronouncing the invocation of the Most Holy Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

1279 The fruit of Baptism, or baptismal grace, is a rich reality that includes forgiveness of original sin and all personal sins, birth into the new life by which man becomes an adoptive son of the Father, a member of Christ and a temple of the Holy Spirit. By this very fact the person baptized is incorporated into the Church, the Body of Christ, and made a sharer in the priesthood of Christ.

1280 Baptism imprints on the soul an indelible spiritual sign, the character, which consecrates the baptized person for Christian worship. Because of the character Baptism cannot be repeated (cf. DS 1609 and DS 1624).

1282 Since the earliest times, Baptism has been administered to children, for it is a grace and a gift of God that does not presuppose any human merit; children are baptized in the faith of the Church. Entry into Christian life gives access to true freedom.

1284 In case of necessity, any person can baptize provided that he have the intention of doing that which the Church does and provided that he pours water on the candidate's head while saying: "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

By our baptism each one of us is called to holiness. May we never fail to hear that call and respond positively as true disciples of Christ.
