Dear Parish Family,

The prophet Jeremiah has always fascinated me. Jeremiah was born about 650 B.C. of a priestly family from the little village of Anathoth, near Jerusalem. While still very young he was called to his task in the thirteenth year of King Josiah (628 B.C.), whose reform, begun with enthusiasm and hope, ended with his death on the battlefield of Megiddo (609 B.C.) as he attempted to stop the northward march of the Egyptian Pharaoh Neco (New American Bible, p. 892).

Jeremiah strongly supported the reforms of King Josiah. After Josiah’s death, however, the old idolatry returned. Jeremiah strongly opposed it and was persecuted for it. He was arrested, imprisoned and publicly disgraced. He would go on to see the city of Jerusalem fall into the hands of the Babylonians who would, after a revolt by the Judeans, destroy the city of Jerusalem and its Temple.

We hear from the prophet in the first reading of the Mass today (for the Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time). “The word of the Lord came to me, saying: Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you (Jer. 1:4-5, 17-19).” Jeremiah’s was a difficult road to travel. Still, he persevered in preaching the word of God.

Let us pray that the Lord will raise up more courageous disciples to give witness to Christ in a world that all too often presumes that God doesn’t even exist. May each one of us be willing to share and defend our faith as pillars “of iron” and “a wall of brass.”
