This Sunday marks the first Sunday of the season of Lent. The Gospel of Luke (4:1-13) takes us to the desert where our Lord fasted for forty days. It was there that he was tempted by the devil. Our Lord rebuffed the devil's attempts to lead him astray, quoting scripture and making clear that *"You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test."*

This season is a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It's a time to deepen our awareness of God's presence in our lives and respond positively to his presence. It's also a time to recognize our need for God's forgiveness and to become profoundly aware of our sinfulness. Still, we also recognize the mercy that comes to us in the Sacrament of Penance & Reconciliation.

On March 20th, from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., St. Mary Parish will be offering the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation on the Diocesan Evening of Reconciliation. Please take advantage of this opportunity to experience the Lord's mercy and love in a unique way.

In addition, St. Mary Parish will be offering a Lenten Mission entitled "Spiritual Booster Shots: Increasing Faith, Hope and Love in Daily Life" on March 11th, 12 and 13th from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. The speaker will be Fr. Mike Brunovsky, O.S.B. Fr. Brunovsky is a teacher at Benedictine High School and offers missions and retreats. Please join us.
