Dear Parish Family,

The Fourth Sunday of Lent takes us to the home of Jesse of Bethlehem. The first reading of today’s Mass is from the first Book of Samuel (16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a). The Lord sends Samuel to Jesse’s house with a mission: He is to anoint one of Jesse’s sons as king. The choice will be the Lord’s.

Samuel arrives with his horn full of oil. Jesse’s sons are all presented to Samuel, but the Lord did not choose any of them. Indeed, “Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance but the Lord looks into the heart.” Samuel asked Jesse, “Are these all the sons you have?” Jesse replied, “There is till the youngest, who is tending the sheep.” Jesse sent for his youngest son. The Lord said, “There – anoint him, for this is the one!”

Samuel anointed David with the oil in his horn “and from that day on, the spirit of the Lord rushed upon David.”

David would eventually become the first king of a united, kingdom of Israel. He would win many battles, compose of hymns of praise to God and lay the groundwork for the building of the Temple of Jerusalem (which would be completed by his son, Solomon). He would also sin greatly and suffer because of it. Still, he repented and returned to the Lord.

His life is a great lesson for us. The Lord knows what is in our hearts and we can hide nothing from him. Indeed, we should open our hearts evermore to the Lord, the Good Shepherd. When we go astray, he will bring us back if we allow him to. We too experience triumphs and losses, as did David. Through it all, the Lord will never abandon us. As the psalm for today’s Mass reminds us, “The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want (Psalm 23).”
