Dear Parish Family,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. The first reading is from the very beginning of the Acts of the Apostles (1:1-11). After our Lord “was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight...they were looking intently at the sky as he was going.” “Suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, ‘Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.’”

Perhaps if we found ourselves among these Men of Galilee looking upward, it might be very tempting to stay there. What an incredible experience it must have been. Still, the work of evangelization awaited them and they would await the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Their gaze would turn from the sky to one another and the mission that Our Blessed Lord had given them.

As we prepare to celebrate Pentecost Sunday next week, may our hearts never fail to trust in the power and presence of God. The Church established by Christ had humble beginnings, by human standards. Still, those Men of Galilee would inspire others by their example and the Good News would be spread throughout the world.

Today, the Church seeks to re-evangelize those nations that have, sadly, turned their gaze toward secularism and atheism. At the same time, there are many who have not heard the Good News. May more men and women throughout our world be filled with the desire to make Christ known and loved. May we be faithful to the call to holiness that comes to us in baptism and give witness to our faith in Almighty God by our lives.
