Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday is the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel of Luke (10:38-42) takes us to a village where Jesus is welcomed by two sisters - Martha and Mary. Mary sits at the feet of Jesus listening to him speak, while Martha is “burdened with much serving.” This scene reminds us of the Benedictine rule of “Ora et labora,” or “Pray and work.” Martha’s work became a source of anxiety and worry. Our Lord tells her that “Mary has chosen the better part...”

Our Lord’s words should not be taken to mean that one should pray to the exclusion of work, or vice versa. A healthy Christian spirituality blends the two together so that, whether we are working or praying, we do all for the glory of God. Our work can be a form of praise, just as our prayer is a work of, and for, God.

There is also time for healthy recreation that nourishes body, mind and soul. During these summer days, I pray that you and your loved ones will experience a renewal of mind, body and soul through time spent in prayer, in your daily work and in time spent together with family.
