Dear Parish Family,

Today is the Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The readings for today's Mass remind us of the power of prayer. More specifically, the first reading from the Book of Genesis (18: 20-32) describes how Abraham pleads with God on behalf of any innocent people who might be living in Sodom and Gomorrah. He asks the Lord if he would spare the city of there were but 50 innocent people there. The Lord answers that he would spare the city of Sodom if fifty innocent people were to be found there. Abraham will continue this line of questioning by asking if this would be true for 45, 40, 30, 20 and "at least ten." The Lord replies in the affirmative to each possible scenario. His final reply states that, "For the sake of those ten, I will not destroy it."

In the Gospel reading from Luke (11: 1- 13), Jesus teaches the disciples how to pray. The Lord's Prayer is well known to all Christians. Our Lord then proceeds to speak of the need to persevere in prayer. He also makes clear the fact that God is good and wants to give us the gift of the Holy Spirit. "Ask and you will receive; Seek and you will find; Knock and the door will be opened to you."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC # 2626 – 2643) teaches that there are basic forms of prayer. There is blessing and adoration. There is also petition, the object of which are, in this order: 1. The grace of forgiveness, 2. The fullness of the reign of God, 3. Every need. Thirdly, there is the prayer of intercession (which is asking on behalf of another). Fourth, there is the prayer of thanksgiving and, finally, there is the prayer of praise.

As we lift up our hearts and minds to God in prayer each day, may we be ever mindful of the needs of others and especially of those most vulnerable in our society.
