Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday is the Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time. We begin the second half of this liturgical season, which will end with the Solemnity of Christ the King. In the Gospel of Luke (12: 13-21), our Blessed Lord cautions us against storing up treasure for ourselves while failing to be “rich in what matters to God.”

To emphasize the point, Jesus tells the crowd a parable about a rich man. The man’s land produced a “bountiful harvest.” His existing barns were not large enough to store the harvest. “He asked himself, ‘What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?’” He decides to tear down his barns and build larger ones. He believes that he will be secure “for many years” and can “rest, eat, drink and be merry.”

“But God said to him, ‘You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?’”

The rich man placed his trust in his material wealth which can be here today and gone tomorrow. He also says something that is very telling. He refers to his bounty as “my harvest.” If, perhaps, he understood this bountiful harvest as coming from God, he might not have been so inclined to hoard what had been given to him. Indeed, his gratitude to God might have inspired him to share his excess with those less fortunate. In doing so, his true treasure would consist of a thankful, generous heart that reached out to others with compassion. His true treasure would allow him to see that God blessed him and with that blessing came a responsibility to others. Hoarding and the fear of losing his material wealth would give way to the freedom experienced by one who understands that all good things come from God.

May we be truly rich in what matters to God.
