Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday is the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. The Gospel reading is from Luke 14:25-33. Our Blessed Lord tells the “Great crowds” that “Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.” Jesus goes on to talk about the need to understand that one must be prepared to do this or else fall short. Can one plan on constructing a tower without first calculating the cost? Can a king march into battle without comprehending the strength of the enemy as opposed to his own?

Discipleship costs us something. To be a faithful Catholic in today’s world requires that we let go of the “possessions” that preclude authentic discipleship. What are these? We may have a need for the approval of others and a desire to be popular. One might have an inordinate attachment to acquire certain material possessions. In effect, a person may not be able to distinguish what they truly need from what they merely want.

This is a time for heroic sacrifice on the part of God’s people. To be sure, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ will not abandon us. May we, through the intercession of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary, make the choice we must make each and every day of our lives. May we always choose to carry our cross and follow He who is the Way, the Truth and the Life – Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
