Dear Parish Family,

This Sunday is the 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time and the first Sunday of the month of October. October has traditionally been recognized by the Church as a month of Mary. On October 7th, the Church celebrates Our Lady of the Rosary. The story of the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (celebrated by the Catholic Church each year on October 7th) is quite interesting.

In the 16th century, Pope St. Pius V (1504–1572) was having difficulty with the Ottoman Turks. They were a genuine threat to Christianity. In response, the Pope united Spain, Venice and the States of the Church in a naval expedition to combat the Turks.

The two navies met for battle in the Gulf of Lepanto in Greece on October 7, 1571. On that same day, as it happened, the Rosary Confraternity of Rome was meeting at the Dominican headquarters there. Those in attendance recited the Rosary for the special intention of the Christians at battle. The Christians defeated the Turks in a great victory and believed that it was due to the intercessory power of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Pope St. Pius V dedicated the day as one of thanksgiving to Our Lady of Victory. Pope Gregory XIII (1502-1585) would later change the name to the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.

Let's commit ourselves to praying the Rosary each day for ourselves, our families, our nation and our world.


