Dear Parish Family,

As we draw near to the end of October, the first day of November awaits us on Friday of this week. November 1st is the Solemnity of All Saints. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. Please consult the bulletin for Mass times.

November is a month in which we pray, in a special way, for those who have died. Those who are in heaven do not need our prayers, as they have attained the end for which we are all created – eternal union with God in the heavenly kingdom. Likewise, those who are in hell are eternally separated from God and, therefore, cannot be aided by our prayers. For those in purgatory, the Church teaches the following:

“All who die in God’s grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven (Catechism of the Catholic Church #1030).”

According to the Catholic Encyclopedia, the clearest Bible reference about prayers for the dead is from the Second Book of Maccabees. When soldiers were preparing the bodies of their slain comrades for burial they discovered they were wearing amulets taken from a pagan temple which violated the law of Deuteronomy so they prayed that God would forgive the sin these men had committed.

The New Testament echoes this notion in the second letter of Timothy when Paul prays for someone who died named Onesiphorus, saying: “May the Lord grant him to find mercy from the Lord on that day.” (Carol Zimmermann, Catholic News Service)

All Souls Day reminds us to pray for the suffering souls in purgatory.

The Roman Catacombs were places of burial for early Christians. They were also places of prayer and continue to be so today.

As we remember our loved ones and friends who have died, let’s pray that they, and all the faithful departed, rest in the peace of the Risen Christ. Amen.
