Dear Parish Family,

The Gospel reading for the 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time is from the holy Gospel according to Luke, chapter 19, verses 1-10. Here we meet a man named Zacchaeus. He “was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man...” The Gospel describes him as “short in stature.” Still, he wants to see Jesus and climbs a sycamore tree so that he might see our Blessed Lord. Jesus sees him and tells Zacchaeus that he must stay at his house.

The crowds are amazed that Jesus would even enter the house of someone who was considered a “sinner” by most of them. Tax collectors were particularly reviled as they collected taxes for the Romans and would often collect more than was required so as to pocket the difference. The Lord Jesus, however, came “to seek and to save what was lost.” Zacchaeus said to the Lord, “Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over.”

Zacchaeus was materially wealthy, but this was not enough for him. He wanted true wealth and he found it in Jesus. Jesus said that Zacchaeus “is a descendant of Abraham.” Our true identity comes from the fact that, by our baptism, we are adopted sons and daughters of God. We are members of Christ’s Body and we have been redeemed by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. We are loved unconditionally by God and we are all called to holiness.

May we persevere in our quest for that true wealth that never perishes. May we never lose sight of the end for which we were created – eternal union with God in the Kingdom of Heaven. Amen.
