Dear Parish Family,

Today marks the last Sunday of Ordinary Time – The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. *The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, formerly referred to as "Christ the King,"* was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 as an antidote to secularism, a way of life which leaves God out of man's thinking and living and organizes his life as if God did not exist. The feast is intended to proclaim in a striking and effective manner Christ's royalty over individuals, families, society, governments, and nations.

Today's Mass establishes the titles for Christ's royalty over men: 1) *Christ is God, the Creator of the universe and hence wields a supreme power over all things; "All things were created by Him";* 2) *Christ is our Redeemer, He purchased us by His precious Blood, and made us His property and possession;* 3) *Christ is Head of the Church, "holding in all things the primacy";* 4) *God bestowed upon Christ the nations of the world as His special possession and dominion.*

Today's Mass also describes the qualities of Christ's kingdom. This kingdom is: 1) *supreme, extending not only to all people but also to their princes and kings;* 2) *universal, extending to all nations and to all places;* 3) *eternal, for "The Lord shall sit a King forever";* 4) *spiritual, Christ's "kingdom is not of this world."* (<https://www.catholicculture.org/culture/liturgicalyear/calendar/day.cfm?date=2019-11-24>)
